I laughed, got dressed and met Lillian for breakfast. The day was bright and clear and not quite as cold as the day before. Better yet there was no wind. We put the boat in the water and motored down to the Rocks. I could see there was one boat there so I headed across the river to a point I like to fish and we cast our bobber in here.

On out first pass Lillian yelled Fish On, and we landed a nice legal fish. This was his first steelhead ever, so our day was a success. We made a few more drifts but got no more bites so we ran across to the Rocks to try it. On our second drift it was Fish On again for Lillian and we released the fish after seeing the adipose fin. Three more drifts without another bite made me wonder if our first spot had settled down enough to be worth another try. Why not, said Lillian, and we headed back across the river.

On our first pass my bobber went down, and I got to release a nice steelhead that had an adipose fin. Whew. I wasn't skunked, and we thought, what the heck let's give it another drift. This time my bobber went down again, and when I yelled at Lillian that I had one on he said, so do I! Just then my fish made a terrific run

under the boat. I stuck my rod as deep as I could and cleared the motors. I went over the side of the boat where Lillian was fighting his fish, and we soon realized that my fish had crossed his line when it made that run. We tried unwinding the tangle by passing rods over and under each others but found it hopeless. I had my fish close to the surface and suddenly I could see his fish just below it. It was HUGE. I said, okay reel yours all the way up to mine, I will hand you my rod and lift both rods up as high as you can. He did it and I managed to slide both fish into the net. It worked, and even better the fish were both keepers!

I figured that was a good way to end the day, so we headed in. We pulled the boat out of the water and then took our fish to the Rivers Restaurant and had the big one measured. It turned out to be 32 1/2 inches long, and was the winner of the contest! Fred Lillian not only caught his first steelhead, he got a limit and one of them won him a Hooked on Toys gift certificate and a Chevron gas card! What a day.

I would say that steelhead season is definitely in full swing now on the upper Columbia, and I also hear that the fishing on Rufus Woods is going great guns. Both of these would be fun, so I guess that's what I'll do!
