It may be late, but our summer season for Chinook salmon and sockeye has finally taken off, and it's about time. Anglers have been frustrated by very high currents and low fish counts since the July 1st opening day of summer runs salmon season. Even the adjusted forecast for the summer run season promised even more Chinook than last year. Sockeye numbers for this year were going be down from last year's record return, but still high enough to provide good action on the upper Columbia, and perhaps another sockeye season on Lake Wenatchee.

Wanapum once again provided the best action in the early season. It was a wild ride for the anglers that fished down there, but at least there were Now there are decent numbers of fish being taken in the Wenatchee area. Pete Flohr, of Hooked on Toys sent me a great photo of his young daughter Isabel with her first king, which weighed over 30 pounds! Reports have gone from hit and miss to daily success from the Wenatchee area all the way up to Wells Dam.

Above Wells is another story. Fishing in the famed Brewster Pool has yet to light up. This is mainly due to the fact that significant numbers of summer runs have just started to appear in the Wenatchee area. They are now making their way up stream and will be arriving in the Brewster area very soon—just in time for the big derby actually.

I caught a bag full of fat perch, and quit when I had enough for a good meal for the two of us. Remember, there is a 25-fish limit on perch at Fish Lake.
