We need to get new people involved and "hooked on fishing", and this is a great way to do it.

I had a terrific time in Moses Lake last Saturday. I was at the 3rd Annual Columbia Basin Trout Derby at Connelly Park. The Moses Lake Irrigation and

Rehabilitation District puts this one on and it's sponsored by Weinstein Beverage. The MLIRD does an excellent job preparing the park after the winter, and an amazing job of organizing the day, to include much more than just fishing. There are important demonstrations for families to observe and other fun activities to enjoy while they are in the park. Moses Lake High School is well represented at this one. The kids volunteer to provide life guard duties, help kids with their fishing gear and even clean the fish.

This coming weekend, on Saturday April 23rd, I will be at the Free Kids Fishing Day at Rock Island. I first invited kids under the age of 15 and their

families to come to the Pit Pond, which is a juvenile's only pond, over twelve years ago. I started doing this at the first of March to get them excited about the early season fishing at Burke and Quincy lakes.

year. He gets great support from the local businesses and provides coffee and donuts in the morning, and cooks hot dogs for everyone later in the day. Pepsi now provides soft drinks for everyone.
